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
### Why are most laboratories windowless and in the basement?

- It's where the magic happens, and we don't want to let our secrets out?
- Vampires really do work in laboratories!
- HIPAA—it's always about HIPAA!!!
- More than likely—because they are not very aesthetically pleasing to look at!
  - Crowded!
  - Loud!
  - Smells!

# Why Remodel??

- Our laboratory was....
  - Crowded
    - In the basement with many support beams to work around
    - Landlocked—no where to expand
  - Poorly Lit
    - Fluorescent light bulbs that reflected off monitors
  - Landlocked
    - As our test menu and accumulation of analyzers grew—we had no where to expand
  - CARPET!!!!!!!
    - ∘ Seriously!!!!

# Where do you start?

- Administration
  - Approvals
- Facilities
  - Timeline
  - Contractors
  - Temporary space
- Equipment Vendors
  - Specs for analyzers
  - Associated costs for moving
- Lab Subject Matter Experts
  - Designate SMEs
  - Brainstorming
  - What we want vs. What we have

# **Team Approach**

- Daily huddle
  - Facilities
  - SME
- Routine check-in with Vendor
  - Site Visit
  - Team meetings with SME/Facilities
- Contingency Plans
  - What goes where if....
- Flexibility
  - Things will change as you move through the process

# First Steps

- Formulate Plan
  - Flooring
  - Plumbing
  - Electrical
  - Lighting
  - Data ports
- Staging
  - Layout
    - Temporary space
    - Flooring install
    - Lighting install

## Second steps...

- Securing temporary lab space
  - Facilities
  - MIS
- Moving equipment into space
  - Vendor help
  - Privacy
  - Communication with Clinic Staff

# **Third Steps**

- Vendors On Site
  - Move equipment to temporary space
  - Meet with construction staff to ensure placement of needed plumbing, electrical, etc.
- SME
  - Set up temporary lab
  - Provide input throughout the whole process
- Deconstruction and Construction Begins!
  - Flooring
  - Lighting
    - Flooring and Lighting done in 5 stages
  - Modular workspaces

- Plumbing completed
  - Water system
- Electrical/Lighting completed
  - UPS
- MIS

# **Chemistry Analyzer in New Home**






## **Modular Lab Benches**

### **Lessons Learned**

- Consult with equipment and analyzer vendors early
  - Fees for moving equipment
  - Electrical needs
  - Plumbing needs
  - Data needs
- You get what you pay for
  - Flooring
  - Sinks
- Ensure delivery dates
- Pay attention when going over the final punch list
