Supply disruptions are widespread

Major impactful events

May 2022: GE temporarily closes Shanghai facility due to COVID-19.

July 2022: Twelve unions representing 90,000 workers at the nation's freight railroads prepare to strike over issues related to pay and understaffing.

Sept. 2022: Hurricane Ian makes landfall in Florida as a category 4 storm, leaving devastation as it moved through South Carolina.

Dec. 2022: Accord temporarily pauses manufacturing at the SEZ plant in India to address 483s following an FDA inspection.

Feb. 2023: Akorn ceases all manufacturing operations in the U.S.

Feb. 2023: Stryker and Zimmer, which represent 97% of the tourniquet cuff market, experience supply challenges; Stryker has no available inventory and issued an urgent medical device correction.

July 2023: Pfizer Rocky Mount manufacturing facility and warehouse hit by an EF-3 tornado.

July 2023: Negotiations halted between UPS and the Teamsters Union as more than 340,000 workers prepare for a strike. UPS controls 52.73% of the U.S. transport and logistics market.

Feb. 2024: Eugia temporarily pauses manufacturing at the Unit 3 facility in India to address 483s following an FDA inspection.

March 2024: Cargo vessel access in and out of the Port of Baltimore suspended for recovery efforts and preliminary investigations after bridge collapse.

April 2024: Taiwan earthquake necessitates assessment of manufacturing facilities.

May 2024: Tariff increases announced on \$18 billion of Chinese imports.

Taiwan earthquakes and Baltimore bridge collapse



Taiwan earthquake

Timeline and background

April 2024: Taiwan earthquake necessitates assessment of manufacturing facilities.

Assessment and actions

Identification: Within 24 hours, location mapped suppliers in the affected area

Outreach: Within 48 hours, outreach to all affected suppliers

Outcome:

- Active monitoring of the situation for 2-3 weeks after
- No disruption noted
- Notice to providers of event acknowledgement provided and no impact noted



Port of Baltimore bridge collapse

Timeline and background

March 2024: Cargo vessel access in and out of the Port of Baltimore suspended for recovery efforts and preliminary investigations.

Assessment and actions

Identification: Within 24 hours, mapped all shipping routes of suppliers **Outreach:** Coordinated with suppliers to determine estimated impact on shipping times.

Outcome:

- Active monitoring of the situation
- · Currently no impact noted
- Notice to providers of current situational knowledge

Assessment of risk

- Competitive market space analysis
- Historical product performance (e.g., FDA and ASHP shortage)
- Geographical risk
- Manufacturer performance (e.g., inspection status, 483s, warning letters)
- Essential medication status or other classifications
- Disproportionate-use considerations (e.g., pediatric or special populations)
- Key starter material to fill finish assessments


